

A note from the Senior Election Officer...

Did you know THAT:

- all notices published in the local newspaper, pertaining to the upcoming election on October 24, 2018, are very important for you to read?
- it is your responsibility to be added to the elector's list?
- in order to vote, a person must be a Canadian citizen, 18 years of age, resident or landowner of that jurisdiction for a minimum period of 6 months prior to election day?
- if you are deemed a voter, you may be qualified to be nominated as a candidate?
- if you have land in Wards I & II, you can **only** vote in the ward that you reside?
- if you are a non-resident, and there are more than 2 people that are registered owners of that land, then you **must** designate only 2 people to vote; each voter **must** sign a form stating this?
- if you are a non-resident and have land in both wards, you **must**, in writing, designate which ward you wish to vote in, otherwise the SEO has the right to designate which ward you will vote in?
- if you register as a candidate, whether you win or lose, you **must** keep records of all your campaign contributions and expenses and produce a financial statement of such proceedings to the CAO of the municipality; there is also a limit as to how much you may spend on promoting yourself as a prospective candidate?
- to become a candidate you **must** file nomination papers?
