

ROSSBURN MUNICIPALITY ELECTION ON OCTOBER 24, 2018

Here are some key points that electors need to know:

- There are only 2 wards in the Rossburn Municipality – **Ward I which consists of all of the Rural area and Ward II which consists of all of the Town area;**
- You can only vote in the ward that you **reside** in, even if you own property in both wards (Town and RM);
- Each person will vote for 1 Head of Council (At Large) and 3 Councillors in the Ward which you reside in;
- You may vote if: you are a Canadian citizen, are 18 years of age or older, a resident of the municipality for at least 6 months prior to the election day, or in the case of a non-resident, is a registered owner of land within the municipality for at least 6 months prior to the election day.
- Be prepared with a photo I.D. such as a driver's license or passport. If you do not have a license or passport, you may present a medical card and a magazine or newspaper with your name and address on the label. You will also need to sign an **oath of the voter**, if you are not on the voters list.
- Everyone eligible to vote will receive a ballot for the Head of Council. This ballot will be white. You will mark only one X for the person you choose.
- Ward I voters will vote for up to 3 councillors. This ballot will be pink. You will mark up to three X's for the persons you choose.
- Ward II voters will vote for up to 3 councillors. This ballot will be yellow. You will mark up to three X's for the persons you choose.
- A ballot will be counted if it is marked so that it clearly indicates the voter's intention, but does not identify the voter.
- A ballot will be rejected if: it is marked in such a way that the voter can be identified, "declined" has been written on it, more votes are marked on it than the voter is entitled to mark, or it does not clearly indicate the intention of the voter.
